
SAME Briefing on 2012 Central Valley Flood Protection Plan

DWR has successfully led the on-time completion of the state of California's first-ever Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP). Adopted on June 29, 2012, by a unanimous vote of the state's Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB), the 2012 CVFPP provides a comprehensive plan to modernize a flood management system in California's Central Valley (i.e., the State Plan of Flood Control) that is composed of about 1,600 miles of state and federal levees, overflow areas, five major flood bypasses, and numerous multi-purpose reservoirs. This system provides protection to more than one million people and \$70 billion in assets in 19 counties within a watershed of about 42,000 square miles.

Preparation of the CVFPP was required by the state's Central Valley Flood Protection Act of 2008 to formulate a systemwide approach to address problems with the state's century-old flood management system in the Central Valley. The plan development and many early implementation actions for emergency repairs, project implementation, and coordination were supported by the seed money provided by the state's voter-approved \$4.9 billion bond measures in 2007, after witnessing the devastation of the Gulf Coast by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005.

The resulting State Systemwide Investment Approach (SSIA) describes a sustainable flood management strategy for improving public safety, ecosystem conditions, and economic stability, while recognizing the financial challenges facing public agencies. The SSIA outlines an approach that will support California's vital agricultural economy, maintain agricultural land uses, limit growth in undeveloped floodplains, and help improve flood system resiliency in the face of climate change. The state of California will give priority to investments in flood risk reduction pro-



jects and programs that incorporate ecosystem restoration and multi-benefit projects, without precluding future actions, should future funding become available.

Full implementation of the SSIA will take 20 to 25 years, with a needed investment of approximate \$17 billion. Since the authorization of the 2007 bond fund, DWR has implemented many critical repairs, major flood management facility improvements, and other important actions to reduce flood risk throughout the Central Valley, and will cover only some of the costs associated with implementing the SSIA. DWR is committed to making progress in all aspects of the recommended SSIA, including plan refinements, critical facility repairs, additional regional project implementation, policy alignment, and prudent

Scholarship:



Sacramento Post 2012 Sustaining Members Forum “Future Federal Opportunities – Looking Forward to 2013 & Beyond”

What federal contract opportunities are expected in 2013 and the ensuing years? How can our SAME Post provide insight to our members on those federal contracts? Hold a Sustaining Members Forum!

The bi-annual Sustaining Members Forum (SMF) was held on October 25th at the Dante Club in Fair Oaks, CA. Despite the weak economy and working



with a new venue, the SMF was a success, once again. Attended by over 130 people, the primary attraction for this event remains a program and speakers focused on networking and learning about engineering and construction opportunities emanating from federal agencies in ensuing years.

Speakers from USACE South Pacific Division, Sacramento and San Francisco Districts, U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs, NAVFAC, Beale AFB, and the California Army National Guard provided an overview and insight on their various programs and contract opportunities forecasted for the near future. BG Michael Wehr, SPD Commander got the program started after brief remarks from Dr. Vida Wright, SAME Regional VP. BG Wehr provided a snapshot of the South Pacific Division construction and inspection

budget expectations moving forward. Responding to last minute program changes, our own COL Bill Leady, Sacramento District Commander and Post President,

was effective in providing an overview on not only Sacramento District, but also for Los Angeles District as COL Mark Toy was unable to participate. Similarly, MAJ Chris Cray described the outlook for his own San Francisco District and for Albuquerque District.

We also heard from Kevin Maxon who highlighted anticipated needs for Veteran Affairs. Kevin was followed by CAPT Marko Medved who discussed NAVFAC expectations throughout the Southwest. Rounding out the presentations were COL Steve Bueth with the California Army National Guard and Rob Nordahl who laid out upcoming needs at Beale Air Force Base.

A special lunch presentation was made by Charlene Hall, Manager of the Travis AFB Fisher House program. Attendees learned that the Fisher House foundation was created to help military families in need where they can stay without charge when one of its members is hospitalized. The 5,000 square foot house accommodates up to seven families or 16 people at a time and provides a comfortable retreat for pa-

tient's families. Since the Travis Fisher House first opened in January 1994, it has served more than 3,200 guests. The average occupancy rate is 100 percent on a "first-come, first-served" basis for those meeting its eligibility criteria. The primary criterion is a NEED to provide a family environment close to the patient. Recognizing the tremendous job that is done, our Sacramento Post was able to make a \$5,000 contribution to the Travis Fisher House. The check was presented to Charlene at the end of her presentation.



Responding to comments from earlier SMF events, this year provided longer break periods. Forum attendees had ample time for networking and viewing exhibitor information.

The SMF is a very full day dedicated to providing our Sustaining Members an opportunity to gain insight on future opportunities and networking. This year's event was especially successful in its entirety.

Scholarship Application Announcement

From 2008 through 2012, the SAME Sacramento Post has awarded 122 scholarships totaling \$182,000 to high school and college students pursuing a degree in engineering and related technical fields such as architecture, mathematics, physics, chemistry, and earth sciences. The scholarships are intended to promote engineering in the United States as well as help students pay for college-related expenses. Scholarships in 2013 are targeted for three student categories:

- ◆ Up to 5 scholarships of \$4K, \$3K, or \$2K may be awarded to college students;
- ◆ Up to 3 scholarships of \$2.5K, \$2K, or \$1.5K may be awarded to community college students;
- ◆ Up to 10 scholarships of \$2K, \$1.5K, or \$1K may be awarded to high school students.

Applications for scholarships in 2013 can be found on the SAME Sacramento Post website at <http://www.samesacramento.org/> and are due by March 18. Applicants are required to submit the application form, a grade transcript, a narrative describing the student's interest in engineering, a list of extracurricular and community service activities, and letters of reference. Scholarship awardees are provided with a SAME student membership and receive their award at a ceremony held during the May 2013 general meeting of the SAME Sacramento Post. Remember, you can't win if you don't apply!


